Musculoskeletal case 17. Presentation

A 30-year-old man was referred for magnetic resonance imaging of a painful right wrist. He had been involved in a motorcycle accident several days earlier and had fallen onto his wrist. Fig. 1 is an axial T_1 -weighted image through the radiocarpal joint. Fig. 2 is a coronal T_1 -weighted image. Dorsovolar and lateral plain radiographs were subsequently obtained for correlation with the magnetic resonance images and are shown in Figs. 3 and 4.

From these images and radiographs can you make the diagnosis?


